Rainbow Airbridge to SOS Children's Village Umtata - Second visit

27th March 2004

Saturday the 27th of March dawned crisp and clear, MET indicated clear skies for both Saturday and Sunday, the clear blue winter sky is now showing itself every now and then and this suited us nicely. We flew down on Saturday morning; the PA 28's departing Grand Central at 07h30 local, the two Cessna's at around 08h30.





Volunteer Pilots and aircraft used:

Ernie arranged four aircraft; two Cessna -182's and two PA-28's, all piloted by volunteer pilots, thanks go to Armand, Lowrens, Francesco, and Wighardt for their support.

Routes taken:

The two Cessna -182's flew direct to Umtata routing south of Estcourt, while the two Pipers routed via Oribi Pietermaritsburg for refuelling, a flying time of some 3 and 4 hours respectively.

Return flights were split up, the two 182 Cessna's did a turn around and flew back after refuelling; the PA-28's stayed over and flew back the following morning, Sunday the 28th.
